Program Descriptions

Acoustic Interlude: John Macdonell hosts and produces this series of acoustic and progressive folk music, featuring the latest recordings from a wide variety of artists as well as classics from the past.

All Things Considered: Award-winning news magazine from National Public Radio.

A Prairie Home Companion: Garrison Keillor hosts this live variety program.

Echoes: Host John Diliberto, a writer for *Billboard*, *Pulse* and other magazines, brings together a wide variety of styles from acoustic to electronic, jazz to space music, avant-garde to rock.

Florida Frontiers: Weekly radio magazine of the Florida Historical Society.

14/59: 14 tunes in 59 minutes of eclectically selected music which knows no boundaries. Pop, world, acoustic, electric—a mix of songs.

Fresh Air: Arts, entertainment and popular culture magazine with Terry Gross.

Hearts of Space: A mix of ambient, electronic, world, new age, classical and experimental music.

Here and Now: Reflects the fluid world of news as it's happening in the middle of the day with timely, smart and in-depth news, interviews and conversation.

Jazz After Hours: New and well-established jazz artists may drop in for a chat, and the music ranges from latest releases to jazz classics. There's news of tours, festivals and clubs—the best places to hear live jazz.
